Introduction

bie Reese, PhD, educator and founder of American Indians in Children's Literature (AICL) blog, delivered the 2019 May Hill Arbuthnot Honor Lecture, "An Indigenous Critique of Whiteness in Children's Literature," on Saturday, April 13, at the Wisconsin Institutes for Discovery in Madison, Wisconsin.

Dr. Reese is a longtime advocate for Native representation and is a former teacher and university professor. She earned her PhD in Education from the University of Illinois, where she also helped establish the Native American House and American Indian Studies program. Dr. Reese also holds an M.Ed degree in Library and Information Science from San Jose State University. She is tribally enrolled at Nambe Owingeh Pueblo in New Mexico.

Barbara A. Genco, 2019 Arbuthnot committee chair, stated, "Our selection of Dr. Reese recognizes her strong modeling of inclusion, integrity, and respect (ALSC Core Values) via the timely insights she shares on the influential blog, American Indians in Children's Literature."

The 2019 lecture committee selected University of Wisconsin at Madison to serve as the host site for Dr. Reese's lecture. Three University units combined and collaborated in the hosting: the Cooperative Children's Book Center (CCBC), the School of Information (the ISchool), and the School of Education.
